# User's Manual

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## 1. Getting started.

### 1.1. Starting **my2thing**.



**Make sure you have Bluetooth activated on your phone.**

Start **my2thing** application. You will notice in the beginning that the application requires confirming use of Bluetooth connectivity. Press "Yes" and **my2thing** splash screen will appear.

If you press "No" application will not start.

## 2. **my2thing** Navigation

Joystick Up, Joystick Right, Joystick Down, Joystick Left и Joystick Push are the buttons you use to navigate controls and switch between menus.

2.1. To select one of the menu options use the LeftSoft button on your phone to select the menu and then use Joystick Up and Joystick Down to switch between different options. Press again the LeftSoft button or Press the Joystick Push button to confirm your selection.

2.2. To switch between controls (fields, drop-down menus) use the Joystick Up and Joystick Down buttons. Use Joystick Push to activate controls and press Joystick Push button to deactivate controls. You can deactivate an input field by pressing Joystick Up or Joystick Down buttons. To switch between tab controls use Joystick Left and Joystick Right.

## 3. Creating your own profile.

### 3.1. Your profile.

Profiles include a brief personal description like: name, birth date, interests, address, phone number etc. During the search of the area for other phones with activated **my2thing** your profile exchanges with the other user's profile in case one is found.



### 3.2. Adding your own profile.

It is necessary to create your own profile otherwise you will not be able to communicate with other users. After starting **my2thing** for the first time a screen where you should add your profile appears.

To switch between different screens use Joystick Left and Joystick Right on your phone. To move between profile fields use Joystick Up and Joystick Down buttons. You can deactivate a field by pressing Joystick Push button or selecting Select (RightSoft button). You can start writing when you are in an input field. The field activates and you can add the required information. Notice that while you are typing **select** button changes to **clear** and lets you delete field contents. Move cursor with Joystick Left and Joystick Right buttons while in edit mode.

When you make a mistake and input incorrect data, an error message will appear notifying you about it. When you confirm the message by pressing OK (LeftSoft button) the wrong field will be automatically marked.

Select the menu using the LeftSoft button to save your profile information. Select Save and **my2thing** splash screen will appear.

### 3.3. Requirements.

The only required field in this section is the nickname. It can not begin with a space. For example `_coco` is not valid as far as `_` is " ". In this case an error message will appear.

The same requirement applies to the name field too.

The information validation in the birth date field is based on what age you entered. An invalid date would be: 21 years old and birth date 10/02/1990. In this case you will get an error report saying that there is a data conflict between the age and birth date you have entered.

**If you have entered everything correctly but still get the same error message please check and adjust the date settings on your phone.**

### 3.4. Changing your own profile.

Select **Enter Profile** to correct or change profile information from **my2thing's** main menu.

## 4. Main Menu Overview.

Use Joystick Up, Joystick Down, Joystick Right and LeftSoft buttons to go through **my2thing's** main menu.



**(Address Book)** Use address book to go over friends and acquaintances information you have saved and in case you intend to change someone's status as well. (See Item 5 "Working with Address Book")

To add information concerning your friends and acquaintances from this screen, select Add from the menu.

When you find a user and begin chat there is an option to save user profile in your phone using Add from the menu.



**(Search)** Select Search from the main menu to start searching. Here you can start searching the area for other **my2thing** users.



**(Chat)** Select **chat** to enter chat mode. Here you can have a chat with other **my2thing** users within the Bluetooth range.



**(Enter Profile)** Select **enter profile** to change your own profile information.



**(Search Profile)** Select **search profile** to enter search criteria. Here you can add information for the people you wish to communicate with, such as: height, weight, interests, name etc. In this case when you search the area and find a certain **my2thing** user, a percentage indicator of coincidence between that user's information and the one you have entered in **search profile** will appear.



**(Option)** To password protect **my2thing** so no one else can use it select **options**.

Notice that the icon at the upper left on the screen changes to show currently chosen menu item. You will also notice that in the white field between Ok and Exit buttons appears the screen name that the chosen menu item leads to.

## 5. Working with Address Book.

The Address book is your electronic diary where you can store information about your personal contacts.

### 5.1. Address Book navigation.

The address book navigation is controlled by the menu and the Joystick Left and Joystick Right buttons on your phone. The arrows that you see show that there are more active profiles that are not visible on the current screen.



Using the LeftSoft button on your phone you go to a menu that has the following options:



As shown on the picture on the left, you can view the profile information, delete or add profile. All options apply to the active profile only (see the above pictures).

### 5.2. View profile information.(**view**)

Select **view** from the menu to view the profile information. You can not change the profile information here except the status icon. Status information of the profile allows you to select different icons whether a certain user is a friend, enemy or acquaintance and enable notification option if a match is found in search mode. In that case you will be warned when you find someone familiar during search mode or background mode (automatic search mode) with activated **my2thing** and his nickname and icon will appear on the search results screen.

### 5.3. Deleting a profile. (**delete**)

Using the Joystick Left and Joystick Right buttons mark the chosen profile and then select **delete** from the menu.

### 5.4. Adding a profile. (**Add**)

To add a profile select **add** from the address book menu. The same rules and limitations when creating your own profile apply here (See Item 3). The only difference is the option for status information of the profile.

**It is important to note that if you try to add a user with the same nickname that already exists in your list it will overwrite the previous user information.**

## 6. Search criteria.



Here on this screen you can define search criteria for the people you wish to communicate with, such as: height, weight, eye-colour, interests etc. This information is used for coincidence evaluation between all profiles found and the entered criteria. As a result a percentage indicator of coincidence will appear on the **search** screen.

Use Joystick Up, Joystick Down, Joystick Left, Joystick Right to switch between fields and RightSoft, LeftSoft buttons to access the **select** button and the menu. The menu options are Save, Back and Cancel.

Select Save from the menu to save the entered criteria.

Select Back to go to **my2thing's** main menu.

The validation rule is that a name must not begin with a space "". The only other limitation is that you are not allowed to enter higher age in the first field than the one in the second field. The same applies to weight and height fields too.

It's important to mention that if you enter data only in the first age field then higher or equal values will be matched and when you enter data only in the second age field then lower or equal values will be matched. The same applies to weight and height fields.

When you enter "-" in the drop down fields it means this value is of no importance.

## 7. Search.

The first step for establishing Bluetooth communication is to find other phones and **my2thing** users within the Bluetooth range. From the search screen you have access to all necessary operations to establish a successful connection with another user and start a chat session.



The main function of this module is searching, finding and extracting profiles. You can access all that features from this screen's menu. Each of them will be described in details later in this section.

### 7.1. Searching the area.



Select **start** from the menu to begin searching the area. In this case **my2thing** will execute a single search. As a result at the upper right on the screen a label will appear notifying you that searching of the area is in progress.



During the searching process select the menu icon and notice that Stop, Back and Cancel options have appeared. Use **stop** to cancel the searching process at any time.

If no phones in the area are found **searching...** label disappears and an empty **found** screen will return.

## 7.2. Finding a user.

What you can find here is varied information about the status of the connection establishment process as well as the phone types in the area.



When a phone with activated Bluetooth is found then it will be automatically added in your found list. The label **device not searched...** indicates that this phone was not searched for activated **my2thing** yet.

When all the phones in the area are found then the process of obtaining information for activated **my2thing** starts.



When **my2thing** application is not activated or available on a phone an **Unknown** label appears in the status field at the end of the search.

If an activated **my2thing** is available a request for user's profile follows.



If the second user's phone is busy at the moment and there is no response to the request then **not available** label appears in the status field.



If everything goes right, **my2thing** will receive another user's profile and send yours.





If the second user fails to send profile in a fixed time a **receive timeout...** label will appear.



If everything goes right at the end of the search a screen (the one in the left) with the other user's nickname and a percentage indicator of coincidence between that user's information and the one you have entered will appear. Status information **done** indicates that you are ready to chat with the user.



If the user "killer" is already in your address book entered with a certain icon then the same icon will appear on the screen.

The whole procedure of searching and connecting repeats for all available phones in the area finally listed one under another. Use Joystick Up and Joystick Down to switch between different users on the list.



If you cancel searching by selecting the **stop** button you will notice that the phones already found remain in the list. You can start the procedure of exchanging profiles for a chosen phone using the **retry** button from the menu or pushing the Joystick Push button on your phone.



When you select **auto** from the menu **my2thing** will search the area at regular intervals. It allows you to minimize **my2thing** and to be notified by sound when a phone is detected in the range.

### 7.3. Starting a chat.



**It is important to note that every successfully searched user is already appearing on the chat screen.** You can start a chat in some different ways.

The first option is to select a user with the Joystick Up and Joystick Down buttons or simply push the Joystick Push button on your phone

The second option is to select **chat** from the menu.

In both cases you will be forwarded to **my2thing's** chat screen.

The third option is to select **back** from the menu and then select **chat** from **my2thing's** main menu.

What happens when another **my2thing** user finds you during search? In that case the communication procedure will be processed by the second phone user. You will be notified by sound when the user finds

you. Go to the chat screen to begin chat by selecting **chat** from **my2thing's** main menu. It is not necessary for you to start the searching procedure in case that user's nickname appears on the chat screen after finding you.

## 8. Chat.

After establishing a successful connection select chat from the main menu and follow the instructions in item 7.3. Starting a chat.

If you have failed in establishing a successful connection a **no chat available** message will appear.



If you have established a successful connection a chat screen like the one on the left will appear. To enter messages to your contacts use the field in the lower part of the screen. The field in the upper part of the screen displays your messages and replies. Over the current screen your contacts nickname tabs appear. The active user tab is colored in blue and the others are gray. When you receive a message the inactive tab will flash in orange.

The default field is the input field. Use the buttons on your phone to enter text messages in the input field.



There are two ways to add emoticons (smileys) to your message. The first option is to switch to emoticons screen using the Joystick Down button and the second one is to select **smileys** from the menu.

This screen allows you to view and select the appropriate emoticon. Press Joystick Push button or just OK button (leftSoft button) to add emoticons and automatically go back to the input field. Use **cancel** or the RightSoft button to exit the emoticons screen and cancel the operation.



Press Joystick Push button or select **send** from the menu to send messages to your contacts. The label over the input field changes from **ready** to **sending....** When a message is successfully delivered the label changes back to **ready**. If the message could not be delivered for some reason an **error** will appear. In that case try to send your message again later on. If the message sending fails after few attempts it may be the other user has already exited the chat session.

Use Joystick Up button to switch between contacts and view messages in the In/Out field. Use Joystick Up to scroll lines up and view all messages the In/Out field.

Use Joystick Left and Joystick Right switch between tabs and chat with another user. When all your contacts can not be displayed on the screen an arrow appears in the upper right corner of the screen indicating that are not visible on the current screen.

Use Joystick Down to switch to the input field.



There is an additional option using **add** from the chat menu to save the active user's profile in **my2thing's** Address Book.

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
